Landlord Input on Inspection Scheduling

Landlords will be receiving an email in the coming weeks from rentalcertification@rlbeach.org about stating preferences for next year's inspection date. Be sure to promptly respond, as this is your opportunity to make sure the inspection date is convenient for you. All rental certification initial inspections will be scheduled upfront. There will be little opportunity to reschedule inspections (and potentially a penalty to do so). Landlords will be notified by October 1st of their inspection date(s), or if applicable, if they are eligible to skip the inspection.

Enjoying the Summer Months

Simple behaviors have a profound impact on the attractiveness of our neighborhoods and our ability to enjoy a summer evening on the patio. Give your neighbors the courtesy of maintaining your yard and keeping your property clear of trash and debris, including bringing in the kids' toys at the end of the day. Two important Village ordinances all residents should be aware of are: (a) Grass or weeds that exceed eight inches must be remedied within 7 days, and (b) Debris, such as trash and/or "stuff" spread on the lawn, must typically be removed within 24-48 hours. Please be aware that neglecting to address a citation can result in fines and liens against your property. Thank you for doing your part to keep our community clean and tidy!

Round Lake Beach residents, we need your help!

We need the right things to end up in your recycling cart to improve the quality of recycling materials. So the next time you toss items in your recycling, follow these three rules:



Recycle all empty bottles, cans, paper and cardboard.



Keep food and liquids out of the recycling.



Empty recyclables directly into your cart - NO bagged recyclables.



You may find a tag on your recycling cart beginning July 23rd

It's important to improve the quality of Round Lake Beach recycling materials, so let's get back to the basics of good recycling. Beginning July 23, you may find a red tag on your recycling cart – a red tag means there was garbage in your recycling. The driver will indicate what materials are not acceptable, leave a red tag, and collect your cart. After the education period, recycling carts that contain unacceptable items (contaminated) will be tagged and not collected. Contaminated carts will be collected on your next regular service day provided that the unacceptable materials are removed from the cart. Working with the Village of Round Lake Beach, we will start this program on the east side of town and then move west.

We ask for your help to Recycle Right and improve the quality of Round Lake Beach's recycling materials!

Mosquito Abatement

Almost 100 acres will be treated by hand, backpack, and helicopter within the Village this summer to reduce nuisance mosquito populations and prevent the spread of the West Nile Virus. Over 2,000 street side catch basins will be treated by technicians on bicycles in June/July to help reduce mosquito breeding in the underground water systems.



Adult mosquito control treatments will be performed during the season to kill adult mosquitoes. These treatments are performed based on adult mosquito surveillance in the area and are not prescheduled. If you would like to be notified prior to spraying, please contact the "Mosquito Hotline" at (800) 942-2555 and asked to be placed on the "Prior Notification" list for the Village.

Homeowners are encouraged to report stagnant water (3 days or more) on their property to the same "Mosquito Hotline". The Village's services are meant to be in addition to abatement activities undertaken by homeowners and businesses on their private property.

- Minimize standing water that serves as breeding sites, such as lids, cans, jars, or old tires.
- Keep shrubs, lawns, and weeds trimmed to eliminate hiding places for adult mosquitoes.
- Fill in or drain any low places in your yard (puddles, ruts, etc.).
- Clean and maintain gutters and downspouts.
- Empty and clean bird baths and small wading pools weekly.
- Engage services of mosquito control specialists.

Electronic Recycling

The drop off area for electronic recycling is located at 1110 Sunset Ave, Round Lake Beach. Monday thru Friday 7:30 am to 3:00 pm and on Saturdays 8:00 am to 1:00 pm, excluding holidays.

Yard Waste/Leaf Pick-Up



Yard Waste stickers can be purchased for \$2.65 each at the Round Lake Beach Village Hall (1937 Municipal Way), Jewel Food Store (900 E. Rollins Road), and Ace Hardware (659 Railroad Avenue).

You may dispose of leaves and other yard waste in brown paper yard waste bags or in 32-gallon cans marked yard waste with yard waste stickers on them. Residents may put out six bags or six 32-gallon cans out per week. If you already subscribe to the yard waste program you do not need a yard waste sticker. Maximum weight per bag or can is less than 50 pounds; branches must be bundled and tied with string or twine and have a yard waste sticker on them. Individual branches and limbs may be no thicker than 2 inches in diameter. The Village picks up tree limbs/debris only after a storm.
